Sample EvangeCube Presentation

Introduction: Hello, my name is _____, and God has sent me here all the way from America to share with you a very important message from Him. May I share this message with you now?

Scene 1: The Problem

Thank you. I am going to use this tool called an EvangeCube to help me share this message with you. Please notice on the right side of this picture is a bright shining light. This represents God who is perfectly holy and righteous and therefore cannot be in the presence of sin. On the left side, there is a man who is colored red and is standing in darkness. He is red because that is the symbol of fire and punishment. In other words, he is red because he has a problem. (If you are on fire you certainly have a big problem.) The problem he has is SIN. Every time we disobey the laws of God we are guilty of committing sin. For example, the Bible says do not lie, so every time we tell a lie, we are guilty of sin. The Bible says do not steal, so every time we take something that does not belong to us, we are guilty of sin, etc. The Bible tells us that we are all guilty of sin. Romans 3:23 says, (**quote Rom 3:23**). This means that everyone here today, including me, has this sin problem. The Bible also tells us that the result of our sin is death. Romans 6:23a says, (**quote Rom 6:23a**). This is why the man is standing in darkness because darkness is the symbol of death. The Bible defines death as separation. There are two types of death. The first type is physical death which occurs when of one's spirit and soul separate from the body, and the body then returns to the earth. We are all familiar with this type of death. The second type of death is much more important and is the one I want us to focus on today, and that is spiritual death. Spiritual death is the separation of one's spirit and soul from God because of sin. The Prophet Isaiah states in Isa 59:2, (**quote Isa 59:2**). Please notice the jagged line on our picture. This jagged line represents the separation between man and God because of man's sin. There is also nothing that we can do on our own to get rid of our sin, so that we can become righteous and be into the presence of the righteous God. The Bible states in Rom 3:10, (**quote Rom 3:10**).

Transition from Scene 1 to Scene 2

If the message ended here, then it would be a very sad message, and we would all leave sad and without any hope. The good news is that the message doesn't end here. Even though man is a sinner and separated from God because of his sin (*open the EvangeCube to scene 2*),

Scene 2: The Solution

God still loves us and wants to have a relationship with us, so He has provided the solution to our sin problem. As the Bible states in Rom 5:8, (**quote Rom 5:8**). He loves us so much that He sacrificed the most precious thing He had to pay the price for our sins so that we can be healed of our spiritual death and receive eternal life with Him. John 3:16 says, (**quote John 3:16**). He sent His Son Jesus Christ down from heaven in the form of a man so that He could be born, live a perfectly sinless life, and then willingly and voluntarily die on the cross in order to shed His holy and righteous blood to pay the price for your sins and mine. Because we are all sinners, we deserve to be nailed to this cross to pay for our sins, but because God loves us so much, He allowed His Son to bare our sins and take our punishment upon Himself. As the Bible states in 1 Pet 2:24, (**quote 1 Pet 2:24**). As He hung on the cross, all the sins of the world—past, present, and future—were being imputed (credited) to Him so that His righteousness could be imputed (credited) to all those who put their faith in Him. As the Bible states in 2 Cor 5:21, (**quote 2 Cor 5:21**). This is the only way that we can become righteous and thereby be in the presence of the holy and righteous God. It must be given to us by God, which He does the very moment we put our faith in His Son Jesus Christ.

Transition from Scene 2 to Scene 3

Once Jesus finished paying the price for our sins (*open the EvangeCube to scene 3*),

Scene 3: The Solution (cont.)

They buried Him. They placed Him in a tomb. They rolled a huge stone across the entrance to the tomb, placed a seal across the stone-covered entrance, and posted a Roman guard to ensure that the tomb was absolutely secure from all human tampering. (**Quote 1 Cor 15:3-4a**).

Transition from Scene 3 to Scene 4

At this point, the enemies of God thought they had won. They thought they had defeated Jesus, but because He was God's Son, the grave could not keep hold on Him. And on the third day, just as He promised He would, (*open the EvangeCube to scene 4*).

He rose from the dead. The good news is that 1 Cor 15:4 goes on to say, (**quote 1 Cor 15:4b**). By raising from the dead, He proved once and for all that He is the Son of God (Rom 1:4) and that He conquered sin and death and that we can have victory over sin and death through Him (1 Cor 15:55-57). (*Move back to Scene 2*) As the Bible states in 1 Pet 3:18, (**quote 1 Pet 3:18 - moving from scene 2 to scene 3 to scene 4 as you quote the verse**).

Transition from Scene 4 to Scene 5

Jesus came and suffered so that He could bring us to God (*open the EvangeCube to scene 5*).

Scene 5: The Solution (cont.)

Because Jesus is the one who died in our place to pay the price for our sins, He is the only one

who can bridge our separation from God the Father. The only way that sinful man can have his sins removed so that he can come into the presence of the holy God is through the cross—the sacrifice—of Jesus Christ. This is why Jesus states in John 14:6, (**quote John 14:6**). He did not say that He is “a” way (i.e., one of many ways), but, rather, He said He is “the” one and only way. This is also why Peter states in Acts 4:12, (**quote Acts 4:12**).

Transition from Scene 5 to Scene 6

I stated earlier that Romans 6:23 states that the wages or result of sin is death. That is absolutely true; however, that verse does not end there. The good news is that Romans 6:23 goes on to say, (*open the EvangeCube to scene 6 as you quote Rom 6:23b*).

Scene 6: The Application

God has sent me here to tell you that He is offering you a gift today, and the gift He is offering you is the gift of salvation and the eternal life that comes with it. A gift is something that you do not earn nor deserve, yet because someone loves you, he gives it to you anyway. Salvation works exactly the same way. We cannot earn it and we certainly do not deserve it, but because God loves us, He offers it to us anyway. As the Bible states in Eph 2:8-9, (**quote Eph 2:8-9**). God wants to have a personal relationship with you, and He has done everything required to make that relationship possible, but you have a decision to make. You can choose to accept the gift of salvation that He is offering you today by turning from your sin and turning to God by putting your faith in His Son Jesus Christ and Him alone for your salvation—by choosing to unite with Him—by choosing to give your heart and life to Him. If you do, then Jesus will take the blood that He shed on the cross and apply it your life and wash away your sin. He will clothe you with His righteousness, adopt you into His family, and you will literally become a child of God. He will also send the Holy Spirit to live in you and guide your life. And when you die, you will get to go to heaven—a place of extreme joy and happiness where there is no pain, sorrow, sickness, sin, or death—a place where you will forever live and be in the very presence of God. That is what eternal life is—getting to go to this amazing place called heaven when you die and spending eternity with God. Or you can choose to reject the gift God is offering you and remain in your sin and when you die you will have to pay for your own sin by going to a place of eternal fire and punishment called hell where you will spend eternity separated from God. You going to hell is not what God wants for you. God has done everything He possibly can to include the sacrifice of His Son so that you could have the opportunity to choose to go to heaven instead of hell, but that choice is yours. God will not force Himself upon anyone. He wants us to choose to love Him just as we want our children to choose to love us. And everyone must make this decision for themselves—no one can make it for you. What must you do to receive the gift of salvation that God is offering you? The Bible says in Rom 10:9-11, (**quote Rom 10:9-11**). Who would like to receive God’s gift of salvation right now by repenting of your sins and giving your heart and life to Jesus Christ?

Lead those who do in the Sinner's Prayer. This is one way to do that. Say, "I going to lead you in a prayer. I want you to repeat aloud this prayer after me. At the end of the prayer, I am going to say amen. When you say amen, this prayer becomes your prayer just is if you had prayed it all yourself. So if you do not believe or mean what you are praying with all your heart, soul, and mind, then do not say amen at the end of the prayer. But if you do believe and mean everything you are praying with all your heart, soul, and mind, then when you say amen at the end of this prayer, God will apply the shed blood of His Son Jesus Christ to your life and thereby wash away your sin and give to you the gift of salvation and eternal life. He will also cover you with the righteousness of His Son, indwell you with the Holy Spirit, and adopt you into His family. So, if you are ready to turn from your sin and give your heart to Jesus Christ so that your sins can be forgiven, please bow your head, close your eyes, and repeat after me. Dear heavenly Father, -- --- (this represents the pause in which you allow the person to repeat aloud what you have just said) I realize that I am a sinner ----- and that my sin has me separated from You. ----- I also realize that there is nothing that I can do on my own ----- to get rid of my sin. ----- But I believe with all my heart, soul, and mind ----- that You sent Your Son Jesus Christ ----- down from heaven in the form of man ----- that He was born of the virgin Mary ----- who conceived Him of the Holy Spirit ----- that He lived a perfectly sinless life ----- and then willingly and voluntarily -- --- sacrificed His life on the cross ----- in order to shed His righteous and holy blood ----- to pay the price for my sin ----- that He was buried ----- and three days later rose from the dead ----- proving to all that He was the Son of God ----- and that He conquered sin and death. ----- Dear Jesus, ----- I repent of my sin ----- and I ask you to forgive me of my sin. ----- I open the door of my heart ----- and I invite You into my heart ----- to be my Lord and my Savior. ----- From this day forward, ----- I promise to love You ----- with all my heart, ----- with all my soul, ----- and with all my mind. ----- And I give You ----- complete and total control ----- of my life. ----- I surrender my life to You Jesus. ----- Thank You Jesus ----- for saving me. ----- Thank You Jesus for dying for me. ----- Now help me Jesus to live for You. ----- Amen." -----

Transition from Scene 6 to Scene 7

Now that you have received this amazing gift, I need to share with you why God has given you this gift and what you need to do to grow in your newly established relationship with Him (*open the EvangeCube to scene 7*).

Scene 7: The Aftermath

God did not save you for your benefit only. First and foremost, He saved you so that you can use the rest of your life to bring Him glory. The most important way in which you can do this is by sharing the message you have just heard with as many people as you possibly can throughout the rest of your life. (Talk to them about what will happen to their loved ones if they die without having Jesus in their hearts. Then invite them to come to the afternoon discipleship session where they will be taught a simple method of how to share their faith with others.)

You also need to begin growing in your relationship with the Lord through daily prayer and study of His Word, as well as regular worship and fellowship with fellow believers. (Introduce the MPP and have him inform the people of the location of his new church and times of his Sunday services.)
